2009 Fall Registration Procedures



It's time to register for Fall classes at Diablo Gymnastics! Please read these instructions carefully before completing the attached registration form.

Students enrolled this summer have priority registration starting July 20th. All other students can register beginning on Monday, August 3rd. For your convenience, we have included space for three children on each family registration form (remember, your third child is discounted 50%). Please complete both front and back pages and attach full payment. We accept Visa, Mastercard, checks, or cash as payment options. We do not accept telephone registrations.

Please give us TWO choices for class times. Please choose carefully, as a \$10 change fee applies if you decide to change class times or drop from classes once enrolled. We will call you immediately if both your first and second choices are unavailable. Confirmation of your child's class time will be sent by mail or email beginning August 5th.

How to choose the correct class for your student:

- Parent Participation: 12 to 28 months, parents attend classes with child, walking on their own; OR
24 to 42 months, parents attend classes with child
- 3 and 4 years old: Able to leave parent and take directions from the teacher, potty trained
Minimum age 36 months
- Prekindergarten: Entering kindergarten in the Fall of 2010
- Kindergarten: Entering kindergarten in the Fall of 2009
- Recreation classes: Enroll by grade in school and instructor approval. Our entry level is Red.
